TEACHING EXPECTATIONS TO STUDENTS

We believe time should be planned for direct teaching of specific behaviors on a regular basis throughout the school year. One common misconception in schools is that students automatically know how to behave appropriately. It is not enough to simply set rules for students to follow. In order to effectively plan and to be consistent throughout the school, teachers will teach the desired behavior 2-3 times per week for 5-15 min.

Curriculum Corner

Math: We are currently working very hard on Subtraction! Any extra help you can give at home in memorizing their subtraction, as well as their addition facts would be greatly appreciated!!

Science: We are learning all about life cycles, especially the life cycle of the **butterfly and the plant**. Students will be asked to sequence the life cycle of the butterfly and the plant. The life cycle of the butterfly is: egg, larva or caterpillar, pupa or chrysalis and adult butterfly. The life cycle of the plant is: seed, root, stems and leaves, flowers, seed pod and back to seed again. Any review you can give to this skill will assist your child in feeling very confident when we assess them beginning of October! Thanks for your support!
